## **HOW DOES ARCHITECTURE RISE ABOVE THE ORDINARY?**

- Presentations by Kjetil T. Thorsen, Takaharu Tezuka, Bjarne Mastenbroek and many others

Today the art of construction has been nearly overtaken by the concept of building as an industrial process. Traditional materials and methods are usually thought to be all but lost. But have we really replaced our knowledge of craft with new strategies of design? Don't computer-driven fabrication and technologies for assembly also provide a means for reconsidering architecture as a material practice?

Organised by the Alvar Aalto Academy, the international **Alvar Aalto Symposium** aims to address the complex relationship between material, craft and culture, not simply as a matter of professional practice but also as a sociological and pedagogical imperative. The 12th symposium will be held **from the 10th to the 12th of August 2012** in Jyväskylä, Finland. The event will feature 14 top practitioners and thinkers from Finland and abroad, including **Richard Sennett**, the American-British sociologist and author, and **Kjetil T. Thorsen**, a founding partner of **Snøhetta** (designers of the famed Oslo Opera House and the Bibliotheca Alexandrina, among others).
