NORDMAK - NORDIC MASTER IN ARCHITECTURAL HERITAGE

The Nordic Master in Architectural Heritage is an academic postgraduate and continuing education program serving as a bridge between theory and practice. As a student, you acquire competencies in the history and theory formation of the field, investigation and documentation, value-based working methods, and conflict resolution in cultural heritage processes.

This Nordic professional master's program involves spending one week during each of the first four semesters alternately in Denmark, Norway, Sweden, and Finland, with instruction, group work, and discussions taking place in the Nordic languages.

NORDMAK is an investment in the future – for cultural heritage, the workplace, and your professional growth. You become a frontrunner in understanding, strengthening, and conveying architectural heritage in buildings, cities, cultural environments, and landscapes, contributing to your personal professional development substantively and methodologically.

Designed for graduates working professionally with architectural heritage – architects, engineers, constructors, planners, building permit processors, archaeologists, historians, museum curators, and more from both private and public sectors, organizations, and administrations. Based at the **Aarhus School of Architecture** in **Denmark, NORDMAK is a cross-Nordic**

collaboration involving the Oslo School of Architecture and Design, the Royal Institute of Art in Stockholm, the Alvar Aalto Foundation, and Aalto University in Helsinki, with teachers and students from across the Nordic region.

NORDMAK establishes the foundation for you to become part of a Nordic expert network organized through the **Nordic Society for Architectural Heritage**, exclusively admitting graduates from the NORDMAK program.

Conducted as a part-time study over 2.5 years, equivalent to one year of work and 60 ECTS points, NORDMAK aims to create synergies between you and your workplace. Mandatory in-person instruction is limited to one week per semester. Each semester, three group assignments and one individual written task are submitted.

You can use tasks and cases from your daily work as a starting point for study assignments. A tuition fee of 28,000 DKK per semester is applicable for each of the 5 semesters, totaling 140,000 DKK for the entire NORDMAK education. Expenses for travel, accommodation, literature, and partially for meals are not included in the fee.

The next NORDMAK cohort begins in **September 2024**, with an application deadline of April 2, 2024. You are required to submit a professionally motivated application, accompanied by a CV, with a response regarding your acceptance expected by mid-May 2024.
